

Route 4

Rock Dam & Rock Lake

(20-30 minutes)

This tour is a little more rugged, with some logging roads. Drive slowly and enjoy a short walk to the scenic Rock Dam. The route continues through Pine Creek Bluffs to Carney and Rock Lakes, both with public access. You will need to retrace a portion of the route, with the option to head north back to M95 at Merriman.

Route 5

Pine Mountain & Hydraulic Falls

(30-45 minutes)

This short drive offers some of the area's best scenery, including a mix of urban and industrial areas. Visit Giant Pine Mountain, home to the largest ski jump in the US standing at 176 feet tall on a hill that's nearly 600 feet about the surrounding landscape, and continue to the Hydraulic Falls Dam for a magnificent view from above.

Route 6

Piers Gorge & Menominee River

(1 - 1.5 hours)

From Norway, head south on US 8, then turn right to reach Piers Gorge. A short drive and walk will take you to a striking stretch of the Menominee River. Return to US 8 and continue to US 141. Drive through the beautiful town of Niagara with the precipice on your right, then head back to US 2.

Route 1

Lake Antoine & Pine Creek Bluffs

(20-30 minutes)

From Iron Mountain head north to Lake Antoine/ Quinnesec Road (1 MI), Drive along the scenic north shore to Lake Antoine Park (3 MI), which offers a beach, picnic area, playground, and fishing. From there turn left out of the park to Upper Pine Creek Road. Follow Upper Pine Creek Road to the Pine Creek Bluffs (8 MI) for a great sunset view. Follow Upper Pine, which now heads south, to Boundary Line Road (9 MI). Turn left on Boundary Line Road for about 1 mile, then turn right onto Valley View Road (10 MI) Follow Valley View Road, turn right on Scenic Road (12 MI) and you'll end up back on US 2 Take US 2 west. At the 15-mile mark Fumee Falls Roadside Park will be on your right. This is a delightful little falls with a few stairs to take to the top. US 2 west will take you back to Iron Mt.

Route 2

Foster City & The Metropolitan Lookout

(1 - 1.5 hours)

From US 2, drive north along the Sturgeon River, a 16-mile stretch known for wildlife. The route continues to Foster City, the site of an old sawmill. Take a left on Highway 569, traveling through Felch to the escarpment and lookout just south of the Fire Tower at Metropolitan. Head south to the Groveland Mine, which leads to the junction with M95, where you can connect to Route 3 or 4.

Route 3

Peavy & Michigamme Falls

(45-60 minutes)

This route takes you to two beautiful, secluded sites. From M69 in Sagola, head west and turn left to find the Peavy Falls Dam. Continue to the Michigamme Dam. Both areas provide public fishing sites in a scenic wilderness setting.
